1. On Tuesday, 7 May 2025, a Single Marine Program Council Meeting was held at the Chow Hall. Melissa, SMP Coordinator, called the meeting to order at 1127. She welcomed everybody and introduced the newly appointed SgtMaj. of MCAS Miramar, SgtMaj. Garcia.
2. **Guest Speakers:**
 - a. ITT/Chanel Warner, Manager of Information, Tickets, and Tours. She informed the council of the move the I.T.T. will be making from their current location (between the Chipotle and McDonalds) to the P.A.R.C. building as well as the construction of a Popeyes replacing the current I.T.T. location.
 - b. Atiya from Personal Finance Management discussed how she gives advice to Active-Duty and the different workshops she offers (finance, car purchase, saving money).
3. **Quality of Life Topics:**
 - a. BLDG 5105 and 5700 series are experiencing warm water issues (taking an unsatisfactory amount of time to warm up) especially after an extended period of no usage. SgtMaj. Garcia informed the members involved that the old water pipes store water and after an extended time without use, remains cold and takes a longer time to run warm water. SgtMaj. Garcia is aware of this issue and is working on having it addressed and remedied so service members can receive warm water in an adequate time.
 - b. A Unit Representative discussed Marines being discontented with the lack parking around the barracks. SgtMaj. Garcia informed the Representative that there simply isn't space to build anymore lots for cars.
 - i. Transportation from the barracks to work was suggested to improve this, however Station funding has recently been cut and building the infrastructure to support this is not feasible at this time.
 - c. BLDG 5408 has issues with streetlights flickering, not working, or not providing adequate lighting for service members in the late evening. No QR

codes were utilized to address the issue and all SMP members were reminded to utilize this feature to log any discrepancies to ensure maintenance is being conducted.

4. **Old Business:** Melissa, SMP Coordinator, proceeded with the SMP's volunteer opportunities, events, and trips that occurred since the last meeting in April.
 - a. **Volunteer/Events/Trips for April:**
 - i. **SMP Monthly Meeting:** Only 3 SEA's and 13 Representatives were in attendance. Low count was attributed to the busy month however alternatives are reminded to attend if primaries are not able to.
 - ii. **Sound the Alarm:** (10/10 volunteers attended) Volunteers achieved their goal to assist the elderly.
 - iii. **Town Hall Meeting with Base Leadership:** (3/3 volunteers attended) A successful event with over ~85 in attendance.
 - iv. **PE Fitness Challenge.:** (26/40 volunteers attended) Volunteers participated, a great event however a push for more attendance is needed.
 - b. **Days of Service Week:**
 1. HQMC mandates a week of volunteering (April 20-26 volunteers attended) in recognition of April's volunteer month.
 - ii. **Easter Volunteer Event:** (10/10 volunteers attended) A great event that even allowed service members to participate in the congregation.
 - iii. **River Habitat Restoration:** (10/10 volunteers attended) Another successful event that allowed members to clean the environment whilst enjoying the scenery and having a good time.
 - iv. **Strict Curl Competition:** (2/2 volunteers attended) Volunteers assisted The Barn staff with managing the competition and motivated the attendees.
 - v. **NMCRS Thrift Store:** (3/3 volunteers attended) The NMCRS appreciates the volunteers the SMP provides to ensure a smooth operation of the event.
 - vi. **STEP Food Distribution:** (3/10 volunteers attended) Although a low attendance the STEP event was successful in handing out staple foods and basic needs to service members and their families.
 - vii. **Blood Drive with Armed Services Blood Program:** (3/4 volunteers attended) The blood drive received 29 donations which equates to roughly ~\$14,000 raised in blood donations.
 - viii. **Volunteer Appreciation Ceremony:** LCpl Franklin from H&HS won volunteer of the year for volunteering a total of 69 hours in 2024.
 - ix. **SMP Monthly Dinner:** (6/6 volunteers attended) A very successful event with +129 members served Panda Express. 10 gift cards were awarded to winners.
 - x. **Wings & Games:** (2/2 volunteers attended) 76 meals were served.
